Operational Success at High-Rate Pumping

In a significant accomplishment, our team successfully performed a high-rate injectivity job of 35 bpm (barrels per minute) in a water disposal well in the eastern region of KSA. The operation was executed smoothly, utilizing two 2,300 HHP frac pumps and three 700 HHP double pumpers, with no Lost Time Incidents (LTI) or Non-Productive Time (NPT). This achievement highlights our commitment to safety, operational efficiency, and technical proficiency in tackling challenging demands effectively.

SPRINT's KSA base remains focused on delivering excellence, fostering innovation, and contributing to the company's growth and industry impact.

Maximizing Well Potential: Water Shut-Off Success Using CemPROTECT

SPRINT performed a water shut-off operation at an HT gas well in the Lower Indus Basin in Pakistan. The well was critical for the client to ensure gas blending in the field and to continue the commercial operation of the field. Prior to the job, the well was producing 3,000 bwpd and 2.2 MMscfd of gas. The target was to shut off the water-producing formations while avoiding contamination of the formation. This was achieved by utilizing CemPROTECT-III, which is 99% soluble in HCl and therefore non-damaging to the formation. After placing the cement plug, the well was kicked off via nitrogen to provide 500 psi underbalance, and the well began to flow at its full potential. Post-job well parameters indicated that water production decreased by 99%, and hydrocarbon production increased by 2.8x, thus extending the well's life.

Maximizing Well Potential Using CT Gas Lift Innovations

The North Basin of Pakistan is rich in oil and gas condensate fields, contributing significantly to the country's energy sector. Most of these fields were discovered four decades ago and are now nearing depletion, causing deterioration in vertical lift performance in the oil wells. To address this, SPRINT proposed the implementation of CT Gas Lift (CTGL) operations at these wells to provide artificial lift assistance and extend the field's commercial life while avoiding costly workover operations. The project began in 2022 with a dummy run using memory tools to calibrate the simulation, followed by a pilot project installation. Based on the success of the pilot project, SPRINT completed four installations of the CTGL strings in the field.

Updates on the Pipeline

The Kurdistan Regional Government (KRG) has expressed optimism regarding the resumption of oil exports through the Erbil-Ceyhan pipeline. Negotiations between Baghdad and Erbil have shown progress, with Baghdad increasing its production cost payment offer to \$16 per barrel, up from the previous \$6 per barrel. Unlike earlier, when the \$6 per barrel offer was rejected, international oil companies (IOCs) have raised no formal objections to the revised offer so far. This development has heightened expectations of resolving the prolonged dispute that has stalled exports since March 25,2023, leading to significant financial losses. Restoring operations through the Erbil-Ceyhan pipeline is viewed as a pivotal step toward economic stability for the KRG and reinvigorating IOCs' activities, fostering growth in the region's oil sector.

Successful Cementing Solutions

We are pleased to announce the successful deployment of CemFLEX-R slurry in a water injection well in the Khurmala field. This 9.5 ppg ultra-lightweight slurry, designed for high-pressure environments, achieved excellent zonal isolation and cement quality, as confirmed by logging results.

To address challenges from saliferous beds and high inclinations, we developed a 12.5 ppg salt-based slurry, balancing cost and performance while meeting the client's requirements. A high-rate displacement technique was also employed to optimize slurry placement, ensuring effective bonding within the salt zone. This solution guarantees long-term zonal isolation and reflects our commitment to innovative, cost-effective solutions.

The achievement was formally recognized by the client for our operational excellence.

Non-Emulsified Retarded HCl Acid System in Well Stimulation

We are proud to announce the successful application of our Non-Emulsified Retarded HCl (UltraREAXH) to stimulate limestone formation with compromised isolation and high-angle fractures in an exploration well in the Khurmala Field. This approach effectively addressed wellbore integrity and reservoir management challenges, resulting in a remarkable increase in oil production and wellhead flowing pressure further demonstrating the effectiveness of this approach. The controlled reduced reactivity of UltraREAXH enabled effective stimulation, prevented formation face dissolution and mitigated future reservoir management challenges. The deeper dominant wormholes created by UltraREAXH during stimulation will enable our customer to drain the pay zone at optimized output for a longer period.



Innovative Stimulation Success Using CarboCLEAN & MaxOIL

Innovative Stimulation Success Using CarboCLEAN and Exemplary Safety Response Another exciting achievement is the successful application of diverter-based CarboCLEAN in the Khurmala Field. This advanced treatment was specifically designed with VES based insitu water sensitive diverter (MaxOIL) and CarboCLEAN with MaxOIL to counter higher concentration of iron minerals in limestone formations. The system was successfully employed to uniformly treat a dual porosity



(highly conductive fracture network) heterogenous limestone formation comprising higher percentage of pyrrhotite and gupeiite minerals. While previous production enhancement strategies had failed to render encouraging results, CarboCLEAN with MaxOIL proved to be extremely effective. This achievement reflects our ongoing commitment to innovative well stimulation technologies that deliver measurable, long-term value for our clients.

Exemplary Safety Response



How long have you been working in the oil field?

I have been in the oilfield since 2019

How has your career progressed since joining Sprint?

My journey in the oilfield began in 2019 as part of my university internship, which later led to onboarding as a Field Engineer Trainee with Sprint in Erbil. During this time, I gained hands-on experience operations, whether it was in the bulk plant, or more meticulous work in the lab, I embraced every opportunity to learn and contribute, I continued to tackle wellsite challenges expanded my expertise. My promotion to Senior Field Engineer in August 2022 marked a significant milestone, as I relocated to our head office in Dubai. As I was advised early on about fieldwork "One day you're sleeping in a comfortable hotel, and the next you're in a rundown cabin on a rig." The field can be unpredictable, so my advice is to stay adaptable, proactive, and, above all, safe.


